

Incorporated: 1779

Origin: This territory was first granted in 1753 as Heidelberg (spelled Hiddleburg in the grant document). The name was probably in honor of George II's visit to his German possessions at the time, and may also have been influenced by Governor Benning Wentworth's European travels. The town was granted again in 1773 as an addition to the Alexandria grant, and named Alexandria Addition, but the name didn't last. It was incorporated as New Londonderry, later shortened to New London, in 1779. New London is the location of Colby-Sawyer College.

Population Trends: Population change for New London, including resident students, totaled 2,053 over 50 years, from 2,236 in 1970 to 4,289 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 31 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population decreased by two percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for New London was 4,417 residents, which ranked 90th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 197.6 persons per square mile of land area. New London contains 22.4 square miles of land area and 3.1 square miles of inland water area.
