Origin: This territory was a part of the Dover and Squamscot Patent known as Bloody Point, in memory of a victory by early colonists over an attacking band of Indians in the late 1600s. Following a boundary dispute with Greenland in 1714, Governor Joseph Dudley gave it the name Newington Parish. In 1952, the US Air Force took command of Portsmouth Airport for a bomber base, and land for expansion was taken from Portsmouth, Newington, and Greenland; about 60 percent of the airport is in Newington. In 1957, the facility was named for Captain Harl Pease, a WWII fighter pilot posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor. The base fell to BRAC closure in 1991, but still houses the NH Air National Guard.

Population Trends: Population change for Newington totaled 14 over 50 years, from 798 in 1970 to 812 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 38 percent increase from 1980 to 1990; the town lost population the other three decennial periods. The town's population increased by eight percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Newington was 821 residents, which ranked 199th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 99.6 persons per square mile of land area. Newington contains 8.2 square miles of land area and 4.1 square miles of inland water area.
