Incorporated: 1727

Origin: This was one of six towns granted by the Massachusetts government in the last year of the reign of King George I. Separated from Exeter in 1727, it was incorporated as Newmarket Parish, and included South Newmarket (Newfields). Newmarket was granted full town privileges by legislature in 1737. It was probably named for Newmarket in County Suffolk, England. The Lamprey River, which runs through the town, was named for John Lamprey. Lamprey is a Saxon word for "a woodland enclosure where peace is to be found." Newmarket was a center of the New England shipping trade with the West Indies.

Population Trends: Population change for Newmarket totaled 6,060 over 50 years, from 3,361 in 1970 to 9,421 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 68 percent increase from 1980 to 1990. The town's population increased by five percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Newmarket was 9,414 residents, which ranked 32nd among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 748.9 persons per square mile of land area. Newmarket contains 12.6 square miles of land area and 1.6 square miles of inland water area.
